<b>4 RMS Poetry Project</b> Professional poets to work with 6th and 7th grade students in Language Arts classes and assist them in producing their own work.	<b>\$6,000.00</b> Renewal
<b>5 Katie Koestner No/Yes Presentation on Date Rape</b> Katie Koestner offers a Date Rape Presentation to 10th and 11th grade students that delivers a three-fold message of successful sexual communication, responsibility in the use of drugs and alcohol, and respect for self and others.	<b>\$1,000.00</b>
<b>6 Scientist in Residence at Camp Canadensis</b> This environmental education project focuses on pond study with an emphasis on aquatic life and water quality. <b>7 Radnor Robotics</b> Start a high school organization that will promote interest in science, mathematics, technology, and engineering and participate in the newly formed FIRST Vex Challenge. <p><b>9 RMS Band Residency</b>            Mr. Edward Lisk, nationally recognized educator, band leader and author, will work with sixth, seventh and eighth grade concert band students during a four day residency. He will bring his unique system of learning that focuses on tone quality, balance, blend and intonation to the students.</p>	<b>\$3,710.00</b>
<p><b>11 SummerTime Achievement in Reading (STAR)</b>            Summer reading camp is offered to K-3 students identified as in need of reading support. The program is an active learning experience incorporating hands on activities, integrating literature, movement and writing.
