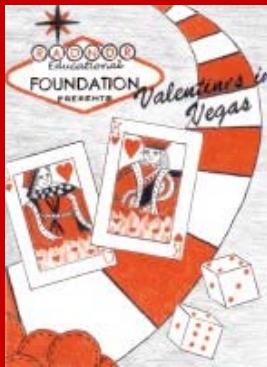

Birds Go Wild at Ithan



Ithan Elementary School has a new bird blind and outdoor classroom setting. The bird blind was built last spring using six large wooden panels with peep-hole cutouts that allow visitors to view birds without disturbing them or their habitat. In October, fifth and sixth graders teamed up to plant bird-friendly plants in the outdoor classroom setting. The students will visit the bird blind regularly to learn about birds and their habitats and to journal about their
